Oracle State Park Center Environmental Education, located in the northern foothills of the Santa Catalina Mountains northeast of Tucson, is next to the community of Oracle. The park opened in 1985 after the land was donated to the state parks board. Its mission is to protect the designated wildlife refuge and serve as an environmental learning center. Educational programs focus on basic ecologic principles and enhance public awareness of the importance of safeguarding natural resources. Interpretive presentations highlight the plant, animal, geologic, and historic character of the area.
